Contribution Rules

- (1) *TRDLS* invites submission of original articles, research notes, and book reviews. In addition, the journal includes research activity reports of RIDLS (e.g., about symposia).
- (2) Manuscripts should be written in clear and concise English and follow the Contribution Guidelines.
- (3) Manuscripts should be sent to the RIDLS Office electronically (e.g. e-mail, Google Drive, Dropbox, etc.).
- (4) Manuscripts submitted to *TRDLS* will be sent to at least 2 peer reviewers and the Editorial Board will make a publication decision on the basis of the reviewers' reports.
- (5) The submission deadline is October 31.

Contribution Guidelines of the *TRDLS*

- (1) General
 1. Submission of a paper that was already published, or has been submitted for publication, in a journal or book in English, Japanese, or any other language is not allowed. If there have been any published/submitted articles written by contributors to this issue on a related subject, please send them together with the new article for review.
 2. Any information that would identify the author/contributor should be excluded from the body of the text. Citations to the author's published work should be made in the third person (e.g., "In earlier work, Ikeno (2015) investigated that..."), not in the first person (e.g., "In earlier work, I investigated that...").
- (2) Manuscript Format
 1. Manuscripts should be typewritten in Microsoft Word format using Times New Roman, 11-point font, and double spaced on A4 size paper. Word length for articles is up to 8,000 words, including notes and references.
 2. The first page should contain the following information:
 - Article category: original article, research note, book review
 - Title of the article
 - Contributing authors' name(s)
 - Institutional affiliation(s) (department, university, city, country; e.g. Graduate School of Education, Hiroshima University, Higashi-Hiroshima, Japan)
 - Abstract (up to 400 words)
 - Keywords (3 to 5 words)
 3. Body of the text should begin on page 2 followed by notes and references.
 4. Figures and Tables (including Lesson Plans) should be inserted in an appropriate place in the body of the text. If Figures and Tables include characters, the font size should be at least 8 points.
 5. All references cited in the text should be listed alphabetically by surname in the APA (American Psychological Association) style at the end of the paper. Titles of references published in languages other than English should be translated into English or if there are existing translations they should be used. Otherwise, they should be given only in the original language (romanized where needed). English translations may be given in parentheses, but they are optional. In these cases, signs such as (J) or (JE) should be added at the end: (J) means "in Japanese," and (JE) means "in Japanese, with an English summary."
 6. It is necessary when a contributor uses a table or figure from a book or from another author's to get consent from the publishing company of the book or an author of each paper.
